Welcome to our third quarter newsletter publication.

As the Membership Committee, one of our mandate is to receive and process New membership applications. 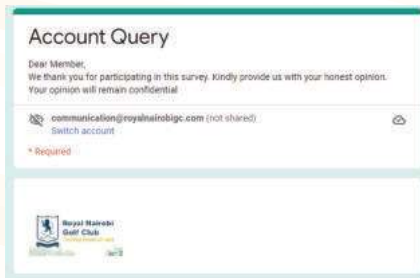


Staff training on fire and safety

Projects

Upper deck renovations

There has been advancement in the EABL-sponsored upper deck's ongoing works of extension and alterations. There have been several requests by members to have washrooms at the upper deck to which the board responded. The extension would thus have 2 washrooms to and a urinal.

The projects committee was responsible with soliciting bids and selecting Prabhu Construction Company to carry out the works.



Ladies & Gents Toilets

The project is on track to either achieve or surpass its goal. The shell of the structure comprising the column bases, columns, slabs 1st and roof slab are complete. Also complete is walling and plaster.

The external will be stone cladded to match the existing columns and terrace walls, internal walls and floors will be tiled.

The slope wouldn't allow us to dispose the waste to the sewer line so we will have to make do with a septic tank adjacent to the big bamboo next to the eighteenth green. These works were financed by the club.



Roof.

Mombasa Canvas were contracted by EABL to replace the Canvas roof which was leaking and was an eye sore. The steel roof structure is complete and the canvas installed to about 80%. Remaining is the area above the washroom extensions Bar Counter

Timber World Limited are contracted by EABL to modify the current upper deck bar, counter and whisky shelves & cabinets.

We are looking end of July to host a soft launch of the upper deck as we await completion of the washroom areas.

Rehabilitation of the Caddy Facility.

This year, the CSR 2021 project made some progress. The project which involves construction of a Caddie Shed comprising a pool table area, a shop, storage, and renovating the washrooms which are currently dilapidated. The project's first phase, laying the foundation and installing the concrete slab, columns, and beams, is still in progress.

Mabati Rolling Mills had pledged to donate 1.87 million worth of roofing materials. They have been to the site assess it the works, and we are now waiting for the essential materials to arrive.

The Southern Dam

We entered into a mutual agreement with CHINA ROAD AND BRIDGE CORPORATION (CRBC), road contractors from to excavate the Dam for the club and in exchange they get to collect marram from there with the support of the Projects Committee Convener, Mr. George Masese. The current dam construction has a total depth of 3 meters and shaped sides. The club has internally constructed a channel that carries storm water from left of no 11 fairway to the Dam.

We anticipate to do additional channels which have been surveyed to enable storm water gets to the southern dam which will have a capacity of close to 40million litres.

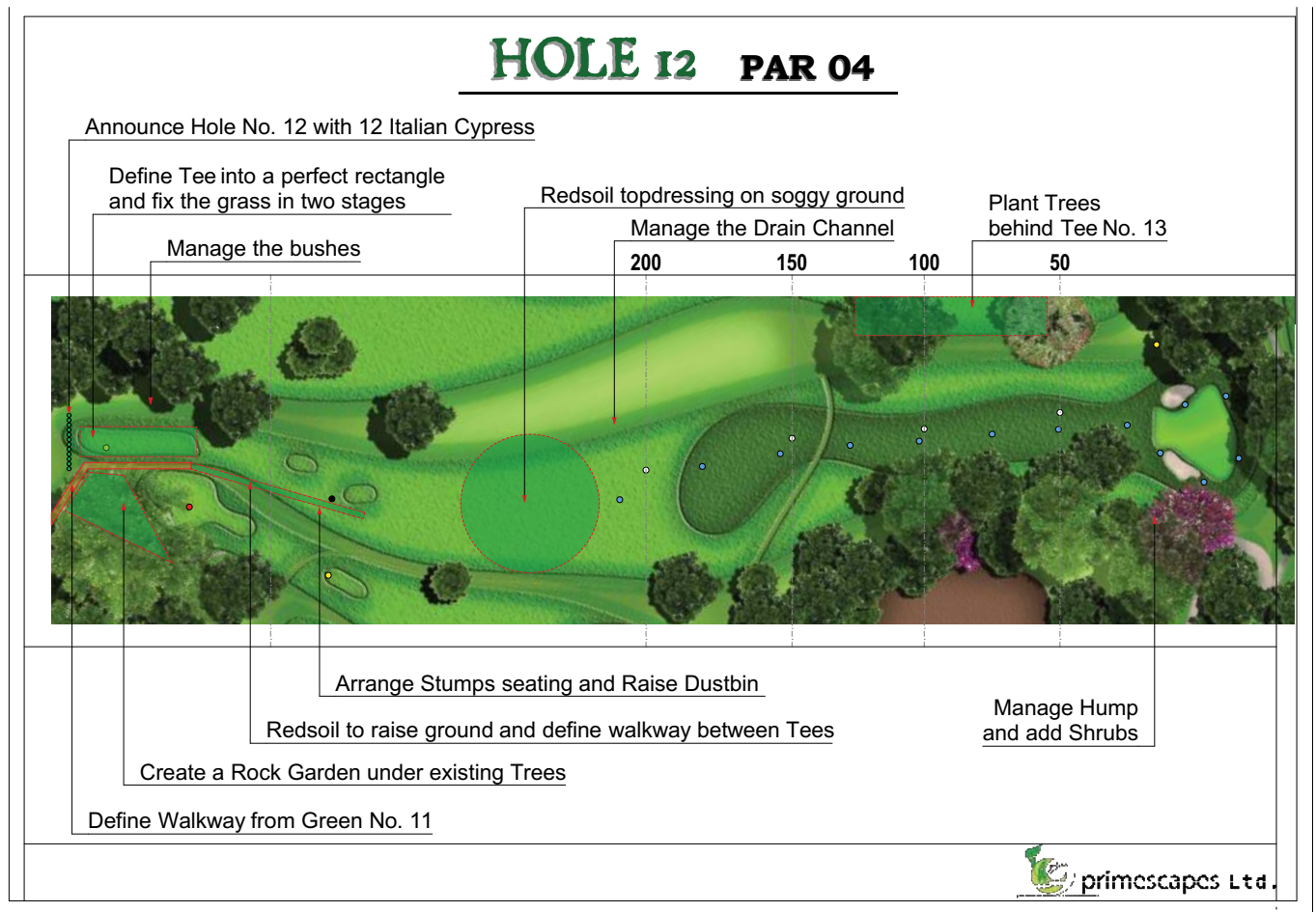

Tricks and Tips of Golf

HEIGHT

You want the same height at the top as you have at address. Note: I haven't changed the flex in my knees or lifted up out of my posture, a huge key for catching the ball on the sweet spot.

CAT

Maximum shoulder turn, minimal hip turn.

HANDS

Let yours drop (as opposed to actively moving them) in response to the shift of your hips toward the target. This puts the club in the "slot," as if by magic.

SHIFT

Transition from backswing to downswing by shifting your hips toward the target. Try to keep everything else very still.

WEIGHT

As your hips shift toward the target, your weight transitions to your left foot. I'm pressuring the ground under my left foot more than ever.
